





I am writing to you, because I want to invite you to a visit of the Veno Pilon gallery in Ajdovščina. The exhibit has been recently updated and it made the gallery more interesting and I believe that it would be a great experience.

Furthermore, the gallery is located on the main Lavrič square in Ajdovščina. The exact address of the gallery is Prešernova ulica 3. The gallery is not that accessible via wheelchair, since there is a stairwell separating the upper and lower level of the gallery. A lot of steps are also present within the house.


In addition, to the permanent collection of Veno Pilon's artwork there is currently an exhibit by Lorna Verlich named Hrepenenje Anime or in English, "The longing of Anime." It is quite a fascinating and extraordinary, according to the online images.

Also, the opening hours are from Tuesday to Friday, from 9.00 to 18.00, on Saturdays and Sundays from 15.00 to 18.00. On Mondays and holidays the gallery is closed. The fee for an adult is $2.50 \in$, for the youth (schoolchildren, pupils, students), retirees and organized groups above 10 people is $1.50 \in$ and for families with two adults and at least one child is $5 \in$.

Too, I believe that the gallery is quite packed with interesting artwork regarding its small size. In addition, the exhibit by Lorna Verlich, Veno Pilon's artwork is quite interesting and fascinating and I believe it is definitely worth spending one afternoon in the gallery.

Report on The Pilon Gallery in Ajdovščina

Introduction

The aim of this report is to present The Pilon Gallery in Ajdovščina to all of the foreign students of art, who are planning on visiting the gallery, and getting to know one of our greatest artist more in detail.

The location and the accessibility to the gallery

The Pilon gallery is located near the main town square in Ajdovščina, more precisely on Prešernova ulica. The yellow and blue gallery comprises two town halls – one of them is Pilon's homestead with the painter's father's bakery. The gallery can be accessed by car, or one can visit it on foot and also see the typical streets in Ajdovščina. Nevertheless, it is also wheelchair accesible.

Exhibitions available

In addition to works of art such as paintings, drawings, graphics and sculptures, the permanent exhibition also includes documentary material and personal items of Veno Pilon. It is also possible to view photographic material and works of art by other authors that were donated or exchanged to the artist Pilon by his friends and acquaintances.

The gallery, however, offers more than that. It is possible to attend music events, lectures, occasional exhibitions in the field of photography and architecture, as well as various literary and cultural events.


Opening hours and entrance fee

The gallery is open from Monday to Friday from 9 am to 6 pm, and on Saturdays and Sundays from 3 pm to 6 pm. On Mondays and public holidays it is not possible to visit the exhibitions, as the gallery is closed.

The entrance fee for young people is 1.50 euros, but entry is free every first Sunday of the month. Conclusion
